Burma/Myanmar is in Southeast Asia bordering to China, India, Thailand, Bangladesh

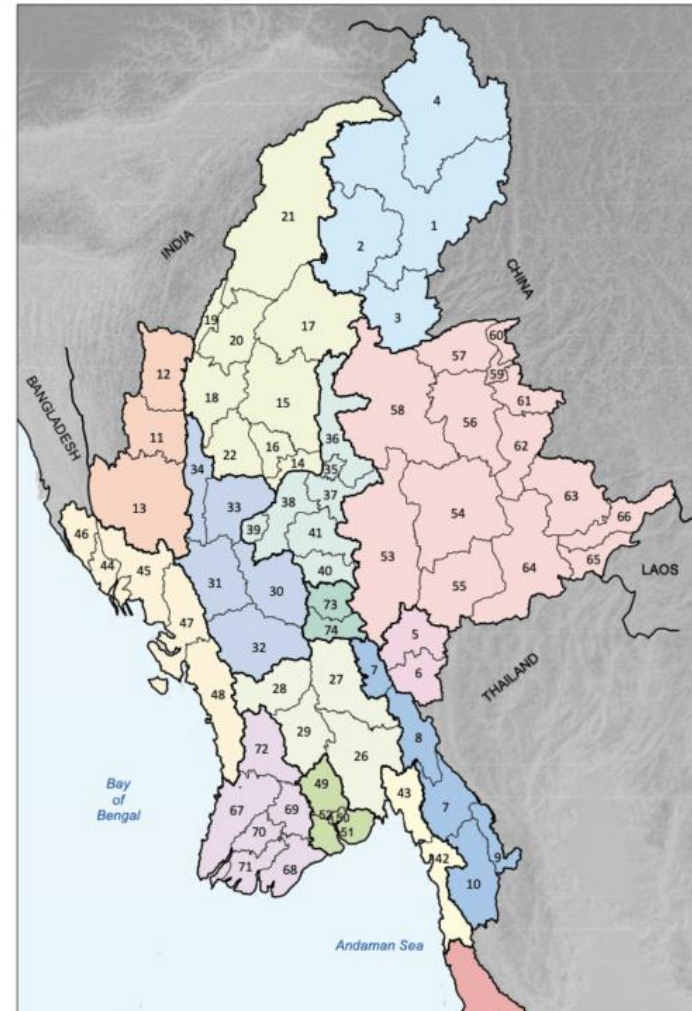
Map 1.2 Administrative Areas

Total Populations: 51,486,253



On Feb. 1, 2021, the military overthrew the democratically elected government

- November 8, 2015: National League for Democracy – NLD won the election (secured 86% seats)
- President: Win Myint
- State Counselor: Aung San Suu Kyi
- November 20, 2020: Burma's election was held. NLD won the elections again with a landslide victory (396 seats of 498)
- The military also known as Tatmadaw alleged voter fraud
- February 1, 2021: The military overthrew the government
- Tatmadaw arrested President Win Myint and Aung San Suu Kyi and others. They are being detained
- February 2, 2021: The military formed the State Administrative Council Myanmar (SAC) m- the military regime
- SAC Chairman: Senior General Min Aung Hlaing, the military chief

Newly elected Members of Parliament formed the Committee and the Government

February 5, 2021: 20 MPs formed Committee Representing Pyidaungsu Hluttaw-CRPH)

March 21, 2021: The military regime declared CRPH to be illegal unlawful association under Under section 17(1) of the Unlawful Associations Act

CRPH formed the National Unity Government

- President: U Win Myint**
- Vice President: Duwa Lashi La**
- State Counselor: Daw Aung San Suu Kyi**
- Prime Minister: Mahn Winn Khaing Thann**
- Cabinet Ministers --**

Civil Disobedient Movement taken place across the country in protesting against the military coup

AAPP 2021 Coup Daily Briefings

- **Defense forces including People Defense Force were formed**

As of June 12, 2021,

- **862 people killed**
- **4848 people under detention**

Refugees

- Since Feb 1, 2021:
Refugees in neighboring countries: 12 000
 - As of Dec. 31, 2020
refugees in neighboring countries: 980,000
- (Note: 867,000 Rohingyas in Bangladesh)

Internally Displaced People -IDPs

- Since Feb. 1, 2021: IDPs in Myanmar: 175,000
- As of Dec. 31, 2020 IDPs in Myanmar: 370,000

UNHCR: Forcibly Displaced people worldwide: 80 MILLION

Refugees

As of Mid-2020: 26.3 Million
(in neighboring countries)

Internally Displaced People -IDPs

As of end of 2019: 45.7

Refugee Definition

The [1951 Refugee Convention](#) is a key legal document and defines a refugee as:

“someone who is unable or unwilling to return to their country of origin owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group, or political opinion.”
